European Explorers: A Google Earth Tour

You have been asked by your kingdom's monarch to reflect on your life's work, the exploration of new lands, and document your past discoveries and voyages. You have stumbled upon a new technology, called Google Earth, to help you in this quest. Create a Google Earth Tour which documents your life's work. Your tour will consist of the following:

- 1. A set of placemarks positioned in the correct geographical locations which represent the stops in your journey. The first should be at the birthplace of your explorer and the description should include biographical details.
- 2. At each placemark, create a short diary entry of your findings (list under the description). Include the reasons why you stopped at this place. Feel free to use "historical license" and first person in these entries.
- 3. List of sources MLA citations handed in on a separate sheet of paper.
